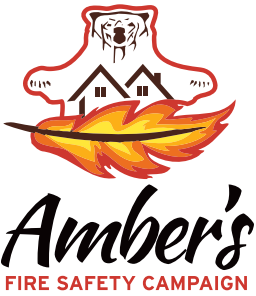

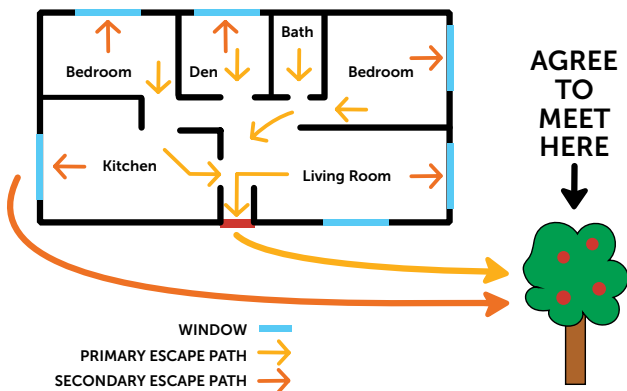
There is no time for planning during an emergency. When a smoke alarm sounds, get out and stay out.

Steps to making your own escape plan:

- Draw a floor-plan of your home.
- Mark two ways out of every room.
- Discuss escape routes with every member of your household.
- Decide who will be responsible for helping children, seniors, people with disabilities and others who require assistance.
- Establish a meeting area outside where everyone will gather when escaping a fire. It should be a safe distance away from your home.
- Have a fire drill. Practice your escape plan at least twice a year.
- Make sure your plan is posted up where everyone in your home can see.
